SPLASH PAD & ZERO-DEPTH ENTRY POOL – RESERVATION REQUIRED

The *Summer in the Bluff* program, which is open to residents of Sergeant Bluff and those that attend the Sergeant Bluff Schools, is proud to announce the opening of the Splash Pad, the zero-depth entry area of the pool and the lap pool swimming area (the water slide will remain closed for all programs). These sites will be open for specific programs and by **reservation only** for **family units and close friends** starting by July 3rd (conditions permitting). We are putting an emphasis on the safety and the well being of residents. Frequent cleaning periods will occur and social distancing requirements will be enforced by limiting the maximum occupancy of the facilities. Use of the facilities will be by reservation and a signed liability waiver will be required for each participant. A parent or legal guardian must complete the form for all attendees under 18 years old.

NOISE ORDINANCE(S)

The City of Sergeant Bluff has two relevant noise ordinances that you should be aware of. It is prohibited to make loud or raucous noises that cause unreasonable distress to the occupants of residences or public buildings in the vicinity (Ord 40.03). It is also prohibited for a dog owner to allow their dog to cause serious annoyance or disturbance by frequent and habitual barking or howling (Ord 55.08).



WHEN IT RAINS IT DRAINS

Storm Water will transport pollutants carelessly left or intentionally placed in or near a storm drain into water bodies used for drinking water, swimming, or fishing. The City prohibits illicit discharges to the Storm Sewer system (Ord. Chapter 101).

- * Never dump anything down storm drains.
- * Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways, sidewalks and roads.
- * Never mow or sweep grass clippings onto the street.
- * Don't hose down driveways (either sweep up or blowback into the yard).
- * Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces.
- * Take your vehicle to the car wash or wash it on the grass.
- * Check car for leaks and recycle motor oil.
- * Pick up after your pet.
- * Seed bare spots in your lawn.
- * Use a compost pile or yard waste collection bin.

The Board of Adjustment reviews and approves variances to the code of ordinances and conditional use permits. Please stop by City Hall at 401 4th Street during regular office hours to pick up an application. Applications must be returned no later than Friday, July 31st, to be considered. The Board of Adjustment meets on an as-needed basis.

PERMIT INSPECTIONS

We would like to remind residents and contractors who receive a building permit that a final inspection shall be made after the permitted work is complete prior to occupancy. A Final Inspection is required to close out all building permits (Eg. pools, sidewalks, fences, decks, new homes, remodels, additions, etc.) This is in accordance with the 2015 International Residential Code and the 2015 International Business Code which was adopted by Ordinance 156.01.
