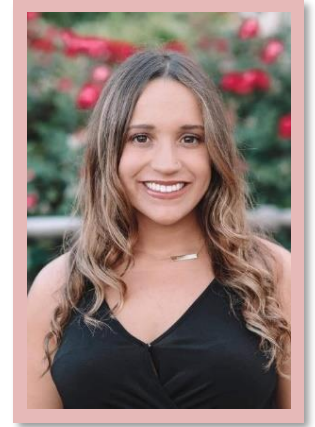

RADON TEST KITS

Radon is a cancer-causing radioactive gas. You cannot see, smell or taste radon, but it may be a problem in your home. The Surgeon General has warned that radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States today. Testing is the only way to know your home's radon levels. There are no immediate symptoms that will alert you to the presence of radon.

You may now purchase test kits from either the Siouxland District Health Department or City Hall for \$7.00. Accepted forms of payment are cash or checks. Checks may be made out to the Siouxland District Health Department. You may call City Hall at 712-943-4244 to make an appointment to pick up a kit.
