- b. For the Trees Please grant they are wanting to replace all the trees that are dying.

4. Recreation

a. Soccer has 160 kids, football had 20 more kids than the previous year, but they did open it up to kindergarteners this year and it has gone well. Referees have been good this year. Volleyball is way down this year. The Arena is open now, so everyone has gone there.
