REVENUE & EXPENDITURE REPORT

1. Other

- a. Discussed issues/concerns regarding the IBF Building and the dog park. Talked about short and long-term goals.
- b. Discussed rental changes and space issues. Also, discussed the changes for the concessions due to everyone that runs concessions operates under the City's License. The Council approved charging a flat rate for renting the concessions. The Parks Board decided on \$200 for half days and \$300 for a full day.
- c. The Board agreed upon short and long term park and recreation goals and priorities for 2023 and updated the long term planning document.

A motion was made by Moriarty, seconded by Tague to approve the flat rate change.

2. Outdoor Pool

- a. Discussed the results of the Survey that went out to the public regarding the pool. A lot of people do not use the pool, but they don't want it to go away. The pool can operate as is with no repairs being made. Plan to come back next month and discuss the pool again.

3. Sergeant Bluff Community Center

- a. There has been lots of events at the center. Every weekend is booked so far. There has been lots of compliments about the new floor.
- b. A ribbon cutting was held for the new gym floor, and it went very well.

4. Parks

- a. The Kiwanis Park bid was awarded, contractor is waiting for the security bond to move forward. The project is still in progress.

5. Recreation

- a. Winter basketball league ended today, 12/14/2022. There are more kids signed up then ever in the past. Eventually
- b. December 1st was the tree lighting and 40-50 people showed up. The plan is to eventually get the entire park lit up. Discussed different outcomes of making the tree lighting a whole event.
- c. 60 people signed up for the Turkey Trot, however, only 30 people showed up due to it being a cold bitter morning.
- d. Winter Festival was held December 4th. Attendance was a little lower than normal. Tyler and Lexi are talking with the Community Action Team about different ideas going forward.
